Spotlight: Ms. Kamal Daruwala

Q: What was the impetus to take up teaching as a career?

A: I have spent close to 7 years in the Banking profession and although I loved banking, it was listless after a while. I was looking for something that would give me a reason to look forward to the day, week after week. I zeroed in on teaching as I love young children and did my B.Ed from **KJ Somaiya Comprehensive College of Education, Training and Research**. I was selected via campus selection into TSS and have never looked back.

Q: What is your take on technology getting into younger hands these days, especially school going kids?

A: Technology is here to stay. Parents and teachers need to learn to harness the power fruitfully and to the advantage of the kids. As much as teaching is demanding, we can always find ways to use technology and make teaching more interactive and impactful. Parents can install multiple filters / net nannies to keep their children from exploring unchartered websites / apps.

Q: Children need to read books to open their minds. In this age of technology, how much of that actually happens outside the school hours.

A: At TSS, kids are encouraged to bring books that have excited them at home—it could be on GK, Cricket, Dinosaurs or pretty much anything else. Reading should not become a chore. Parents can lead the way with a lot of bedtime reading—even if it is one story a day.

Q: What are the life skills that kids of Gen Y need to possess to be successful?

- **A:** 1. **Problem Solving Skills**: Today's generation lacks the problem solving skills. They do not want to find ways to solve a problem independently. Even for minor issues they go running to parents.
- 2. **Acceptance**: Kids today do not want to hear the word no and are not ready to accept failure as a part of life.
- 3. **Value of Hard Work**: Today's generation believes in instant gratification of needs. We have to teach them the value of hard work and achieving things based on hard work.

Q: What has your experience of working at TSS been so far?

A: My experience working with TSS can be described as rewarding and fulfilling. I changed my career path because I wanted to do something that made me happy. My job here, no matter how demanding it is at times gives me immense happiness and satisfaction. I have learned skills that will serve me lifelong both professionally and personally. A hug from my students no matter what classes they have graduated into is the most satisfying result of working with these young minds

A banker-turned-educator, Ms. Kamal is a very optimistic and talented teacher at TSS. She loves working with young children and moulding their minds. Ms. Kamal shares that the career shift to a teacher in 2014 at TSS has been extremely gratifying and she feels immensely happy spending her time in the company of young children at school. Spotlight: Ms. Lakshmi Vaid

Q: Tell us about your journey leading to your profession as a teacher.

A: After about 8 years in the Corporate life, I was looking at changing gears into something more satisfying, and it was my mother who propelled me into the area of teaching. She has tonnes of experience of bringing up her children and niece and nephews and I trusted her instinct while entering the world of teaching. I completed my B.Ed. when my child was 3 years old, and it has been a wonderful experience so far.

Q: What are the challenges in teaching, especially English to students, who have access to technology these days?

A: Thorough preparation is a must and although one learns with time, students' questions can sometimes trip you at times. Frankly, technology is here to stay, and as teachers we must learn to anticipate most of the questions. The canvas of teaching is very vast, so every time I teach a chapter it is a learning experience from where I better my skills all the time. As teachers, we must also learn to adapt to using and leveraging technology. And as a class teacher, one has to be a child at heart, with no prescriptive way of living. Leading a group of pre-teens also means that as a teacher, I need to distinguish between various areas—the learning spaces, when to keep quiet, when to listen, when to sort issues or handle arrogance.

Q: As a mother and a teacher, has reading taken a back seat in today's fast paced lives?

A: Social media has definitely changed the way we write or speak. Spellings and vocabulary are often compromised by the students these days. Abbreviations hitherto unknown like brb, Lol etc., are appearing in answer sheets too !! I take these aberrations as learning opportunities of engaging the child in a humorous manner and most of the times, the student realizes he/she has attempted the answer wrongly. At home, parent engagement with the child (with due censorship and supervision of their screen time) along with reading to / with the child are methods that have long term positive impacts.

Q: What has your experience of working in TSS been so far ?

A: It's been a very enriching experience. My role and the wide canvas that TSS and its management provides brings out my creativity and passion to try out new things.

Q: What are the life skills that gen Y need to possess to be successful?

A: Students need to have a sense of gratitude and empathy. That combined with taking failure up chin and being compassionate will help them grow into wonderful human beings. I think its also necessary for them to be flexible with plans but not goals.
